Membership

North Fork Senior Connections embraces a culture where everyone is considered a member. Some members exclusively receive services, many exclusively volunteer to provide service, but there are many who both receive services and volunteer. The organization is successful because of the financial support from our members and donors and our grantors, and we depend upon the volunteers whose service allows our elder members to age in place.

Membership in North Fork Senior Connections is evolving as we seek to serve the needs of the greatest number of seniors in our community. The culture in our senior community is one of independence and self-sufficiency and clarifying our outreach efforts to meet their needs has been a challenge. It has also been essential to limit membership outreach to our ser-



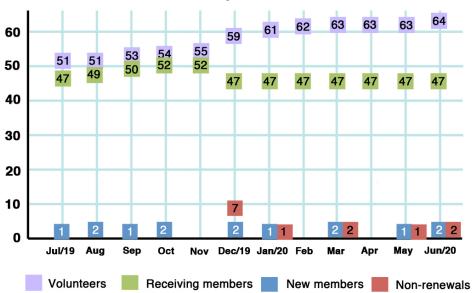
vice area and to neighborhoods where we have volunteers available to meet the needs. Another potential obstacle has been the suggested donation for membership, but we are committed to

Volunteer/Service Activities

Service activities are at the heart of what we do at North Fork Senior Connections. Members submit requests for assistance and our volunteers pick up those jobs they are willing and able to do. The highlight of our service activities has been the Service Saturdays twice yearly.



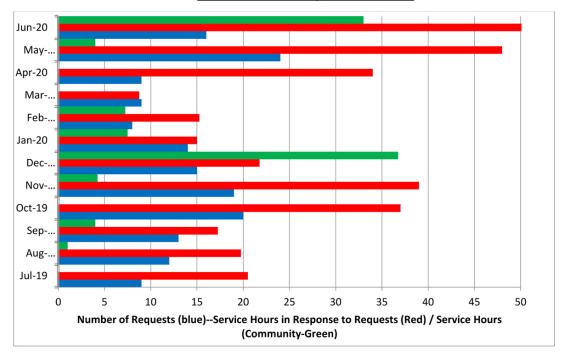
Unfortunately, this year both Service Saturdays were impacted by events beyond our control. In November, we had an early snow and freeze at the end of October making it impossible to rake leaves or other tasks with significant snow on the ground. Then, in the spring, the world was impacted

by the cor<mark>ona virus pandemic and social/physical distancing made work parties impossible.</mark>
Thank you to all the volunteers who managed to help our members take care of outdoor tasks individually under these circumstances.

In addition to responding to service requests for indiividual receiving members, many volunteers help with community or village tasks such as leadership duties, help with events, phone calls to members, and driving for events. Volunteers can enter those hours directly on our NFSC website or call to have us enter the numbers. The time volunteers contribute to NFSC is a major value of the organization and we want to recognize their contributions.



Volunteer Activity 2019 - 2020



The graph shows the number of hours volunteers provided to the community by requests (red) in direct response to the requests (blue bar) and in an effort to make the community better for seniors (green bar). The latter consisted of work at events, transport of people to events, and removal of snow. This graph does not include the work that occurred related to Service Saturday, during which 45 volunteers contributed 150.75 hours to the activities enabling seniors to remain in their homes. Nor does the graph reflect the 330.75 hours that board members and other volunteers contributed to phone calls, meetings, and preparation of the newsletter for members.

Foundation Grants

Events

Events are an essential component of North Fork Senior Connections. The relationships members and volunteers forge with each other and the information learned in the workshops sponsored are as important to our ability to age in place as one-to-one help with chores and transportation. Ser-

vice parties, as well, are important avenues for volunteer recruitment and community outreach.

NFSC presented or sponsored 15 different activities during the first year of our status as an independent organization. Several other events had to be cancelled due to the corona virus, such as "Conversations About Death" (March), a second class of "Stepping On" (beginning in April), game day, and senior exercises scheduled for the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of the month, beginning in April. Participants especially appreciated the increased number of Social events.





As we plan for future events in light of the impact of Covid-19, we are looking at using online platforms such as Zoom, and socially distanced picnics where participants bring their own their own food and eating utensiles. Any and all suggestions are welcome!
