community into the life of our beautiful valley.



Paonia Path of Least Resistance Gardening Class

This year we will be providing a 4x8' green metal raised beds installed at the homes of six partici-

pants, complete with organic compost, soil, seeds, fertilizer, drip, and row cover/ hoops.



Two sets of classes

will run alternating weeks. Series 1 will feature presentations with Q&A, repeating last year's offerings. Series 2 classes follow one week later, offering the same topics but focusing on problem solving for anyone with an active ongoing garden. Everyone is welcome to any and all classes.

The January 22 class will pool buying power by placing group orders to Territorial, Johnny's, and High Desert Seeds.

You can cut your seed bill up to 90% by ordering portions of packets and paying only that portion.
