


Finding Solutions to Help Seniors Age in Place

Spotlight on Volunteers - Bob McHugh

Meet new volunteer Bob McHugh. though he's not the Bob McHugh who graduated



from Paonia High School in the 1950's, Bob (age 82) has lived in Paonia since 1997 and is known around the area as an architect of note and for his interest in historic preservation. Bob is supportive of NFSC's mission to help seniors to age in place, having researched and

designed age-friendly homes, including his own.

Since last November, Bob has had an impact on the town of Paonia as a new volunteer to North Fork Senior Connections. When asked about his reasons for joining, Bob allowed that he himself was a senior and likened his actions to a saying his late brother had regarding funerals - "if you don't participate, no one will come to yours."

Despite the season and the presence of Covid, Bob has been pretty active as a NFSC volunteer in the 5 months since he joined. He has worked with a group to clean a new member's house following a move, helped with gutter clearing in the Fall, shoveled snow several times this winter and joined the caroling group before Christmas. His prior community participation has included Blue Sage Center for the Arts, Rotary and Paonia Chamber of Commerce along with years of volunteer activities in Steamboat Springs. He is also known for his presentations on historic preservation, American barns (including a tour of local barns), and Machu Picchu.

When you see Bob at NFSC events and around town, take some time to get to know him. You can learn a lot!
