Life is a journey with twists and turns, and it doesn't come with a map. When Linda McCone grew up in California and became a high school teacher of science and Spanish, she couldn't have imagined she'd become the program director for North Fork Senior Connections. Soon after 9/11, when Linda McCone's mother got lost on her way to a familiar airport and



threw away her cell phone, it was time for a visit to the doctor. A neurologist explained that her brain had shrunk. Mom went into assisted living, then memory care, and finally hospice. That led to Linda becoming an ombudsman for the elderly.

"I found out that I got more out of being with dementia patients than teaching high school." As a program director for Lutheran Community Services in Tacoma, Linda developed Memory Café, Senior Friends, and classes for memory loss and caregivers. She retired on June 15, 2018, moved with husband John Valentine to Paonia on June 28, and by July 3 had become a volunteer with seniors in the North Fork Valley. "Linda and I both arrived in Paonia at roughly the same time in 2018," explains Bruce Woodside, the Board chair for Senior Connections, "and encountered each other at the sign-up booth for NFSC's predecessor, 'A Little Help,' during Cherry Days that year. Linda and her husband John have become our good friends and colleagues over these years, and Linda in particular fully embraced the mission of the organization—even to the point of focusing that mission by helping transform our efforts into the locally-controlled non-profit that is now North Fork Senior Connections. She was literally there at its beginning, inventing the job of day-to-day management of the organization. During these past few stressful years, she has steered a steady course for members and volunteers alike in ways too numerous to count." Linda McCone will be deeply missed as North Fork Senior Connections' program director, but successful organizations survive change and we'll continue to help older adults age in place with dignity. Besides continuing as the ombudsman for the Paonia Care Center, Linda will help keep the Paonia Senior Center vital as its new vice-president. Beginning on April 19, she'll also assist Randy Campbell in leading a free 8-week course to "Boost Your Brain & Memory." It's said that, "Old age comes at a bad time: When you finally know everything, you start to forget everything you know!" Taking action can make a big difference.
