Once upon a time collaboration was a dirty word.
Though collaboration during wartime dates back
to prehistory, in 1940 the word came into common usage when the Vichy government of France
cooperated with the Nazis.

But in the North Fork Valley, collaboration gets things done. As Margaret Mead said: "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed people can change the world. Indeed. It is the only thing that ever has."

Whenever we schedule one of our semi-annual "Service Saturdays" (just held on May 14) we reach out to the Paonia Experiential Leadership Academy. Young Emerson Wassell, son of the school's administrators, says, "I like Service Saturday because I get to do unusual jobs that I'm not usually allowed to do like lifting swamp coolers and cleaning windows... I think it's important for people to collaborate so they can get to know each other better." His school-mate Zinnia Bender adds, "I really like working with people who are not my age. I think that grownups collaborating with kids is important because some grownups don't get to be with kids and when they do, it makes them happy."

North Fork Senior Connections has collaborated with more than a dozen wonderful local organizations ranging from Kids Pasta Project to the Blue Sage Center for the Arts, from Jodi Simpson's kindergarten class at Paonia Elementary School to WSCC. In September of 2021 North Fork Senior Connections moved our office into the Paonia Senior Center on Third Street. Linda McCone, now vice-president of the Center, explains, "Even prior to Covid, attendance was poor, but when the Center closed for 15 months due to the pandemic many seniors languished due to the social isolation imposed by the restrictions. Collaboration has breathed life back into the Paonia Senior Center."

Sharing a space, both organizations work to keep local elders active, and by joining forces we've made the Center into a lively place where seniors

gather and thrive. Stop by and see us!


