DRIVERS NEEDED!

North Fork Senior Connections is preparing to launch its *Neighborly Rides* program in July of this year. Once initiated, seniors without transportation will be able to schedule rides for medical appointments, attend senior programs and events, and shop for local food — on their own timetable. And there will be no charge for this service.

We are currently recruiting volunteer drivers from the Crawford, Hotchkiss, and Paonia areas. If you have a car in reliable shape, a clean, recent driving record, and can pass a criminal background check, please consider assisting your neighbors in this way. This program is just one part of an overall effort to better address the needs of local seniors and make it easier for volunteers to arrange for and obtain opportunities to lend a helping hand — but we can't do it without you.

Drivers will be able to choose which requests to take on and how often they are available. Mileage reimbursement may be available, pending grant funding.

The CSA is Underway

You've made a difference in the lives of older adults in the North Fork Valley who struggle with food insecurity. Through your generosity, we've been able to expand our outreach to thirty recipients — a 50% increase — who will receive weekly deliveries of fresh produce from the Living Farm for thirty weeks. April 28th marked our first delivery for 2023, and the recipients were thrilled to receive lettuce, spinach, sweet carrots and a jar of delicious farm-made marinara sauce (since it's so early in the new growing season.)

Know that your contribution brought both joy and nutrition to a local elder. One woman told us, "It makes me cry—I feel like I won the lottery! Bless you all and thank you so much."

There's still time to designate a special donation to this effort. A check for \$120 will cover deliveries for 10 weeks, and you know that your donation will be put to work every Friday throughout the season.

Potluck and Pie!


Our generous supporters at Mountain Oven have provided some wonderful fruit pies, so join us at the Paonia Senior Center on Tuesday, June 13,
