Who says there are no free rides? After months of planning, North Fork Senior Connections is ready to offer no-cost transportation to older adults headed to medical appointments, shopping, or events. If you've felt isolated in our rural communities of Hotchkiss, Crawford, or Paonia, now a simple phone call can summon a friendly driver to



your door, ready to deliver you to your Delta County location.

"The Rides Scheduler transportation program has proven effective—even life-changing—in other parts of the West, and we're excited to bring it to our members here in the North Fork Valley," says Bonnie Eisenberg, the force behind the new initiative. "All seniors have to do is call me at 970.808.1009 one or two weeks in advance and I'll enter your request in our online system. Currently the parameters include all areas of Delta County, but if you need to reach Grand Junction or Montrose we'll try to accommodate—just no guarantees. If you're not already enrolled with

North Fork Senior Connections, we can even process your membership during that first phone call. Our goal is to bring easy access to the wider world for all our older adults."

Bonnie, who serves as the Vice-Chair of the Senior Connections Board of Directors, will enter your information into our scheduling program, notifying registered drivers of your request. When a driver accepts the assignment you will receive an email confirmation, plus another the day before as a reminder. (If you aren't a computer user, phone calls can be arranged.)

Are you a good driver willing to aid older adults with transportation needs? North Fork Senior Connections is still accepting applications for folks willing to offer occasional rides—when it's convenient with your schedule—with mileage reimbursement available. We especially need folks in the Crawford area. Please contact Bonnie or NFSC staff if you'd like to support this important initiative. Remember: it's a lot easier to accept assistance when you've paid it forward. This program is all about neighbors helping each other.

Know an older adult in the Valley who struggles with transportation issues? Please let us know and we'll reach out to them. Together we can improve the quality of life for North Fork elders.

Times are changing, and rounding up mustangs is no longer about capturing horses to train for ranch work. The film was adapted from a short story by one of Marilyn's husbands, the famed playwright Arthur Miller. It was the last movie made by both Monroe and Gable.
