# Abundance

In an era when people disagree about way too many things, here's something we can agree on: Nobody should go hungry. 108 billion pounds of food is discarded in our country every year, but here in the North Fork Valley concerned citizens are fighting against that waste.

UpRoot Colorado "works to increase the nutritional security of Coloradans by harvest-



ing and redistributing surplus, nutrient-dense foods while supporting the resilience of farm-

ers." 35-40% of produce goes uneaten each year, but by partnering with Delta County farms the folks at UpRoot are changing the numbers.

Abbey Andersen is the gleaning and food systems coordinator for the local branch of UpRoot Colorado, organizing teams of 5-10 volunteers to harvest good produce left in the fields after the commercial harvest is completed. Now UpRoot volunteers deliver the surplus to food pantries

nections, available from our office at the Paonia Senior Center. We also deliver produce to twenty elders through our mini-CSA collaboration with The Living Farm.

To share that abundance, consider sponsoring one of the Thursday lunches that Linda McCone has arranged here at the Paonia Senior Center. Local restaurants who cater the food for twenty diners receive ten dollars per person, while the diners pay \$4. If you can spare \$120 (maybe from your Tabor refund check?) you can help keep this great program going. The Paonia Senior Center can be reached at 970.527.3435. 
