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Aging With Oomph!

Nobody ever said growing older is easy, but it *can* be done with grace and enthusiasm. If you had the chance to attend the

North Fork Senior Connections program "Crossing the Generational Divide" in June you heard lively elders from our local communities speaking with teens, which made one thing clear: seniors have a lot to offer. But for most of us, successful aging takes effort.

When asked about the secret to her continued vitality, Marjorie True responded, "Genetics—Dad made it to 93, Mom to 95!" But not all of us are blessed with inherited longevity. 82-year-old Marjorie further revealed she's always lived an active and

healthy life (except for a long-ago bout of smoking...) with yoga, walking and gardening keeping her fit. Now she's a regular attendee of the SAIL classes presented by North Fork EMS—maybe that's why she was able to be an active participant in our Service Saturday at the end of October, helping other local seniors prepare for the upcoming winter.

A hospice nurse until ten years ago, Marjorie now volunteers in respite care for Hope West, serves on the board of the Hotchkiss-Crawford Historical Society where she organizes the docents, and is part of the food prep team for the Abraham Connection in Delta. "Find a support system—whether it's family, or friends or an organization," she advises.

"Stimulate yourself with various activities" and "develop relationships that provide caring and emotional involvement."

Another perennial Service Saturday volunteer, 83-year-old Bob McHugh credits his vitality to "eating the right stuff and exercising." Despite a health crisis a few years ago

Bob completes a regimen of stretches and rides his bicycle every day. Active as a realtor, he serves on the Rotary (including helping with highway cleanup) and provides educational programs for various senior facilities. as well as shoveling snow each year for a less-robust Paonia senior. Bob's recommendation: "Don't give up—and don't have 'I'm getting old' at the forefront of your mind. And no whining!" Born in Delta County the same year, 83-year-old Claudia King is a force of nature. "None of my family are here, but this is still where I want to live!" As far as volunteering: "Anywhere I go I try to help, but I'm passionate about scholarships for women." It definitely works for her!
