Are You Aging Artfully?

Nobody ever said aging is easy. To make things harder, a recent Australian study discovered that "ageism may be the most normalized and socially accepted form of prejudice." In fact, in 2021 the World Health Organization's Global Report on Ageism found that one in two people worldwide are ageist.

Not the folks at Next50. As a private national foundation based in Denver, their organization is dedicated to creating a world that values aging. Our own North Fork Creative Coalition has received a Next50 grant that will bring free arts education to our Valley for those 50+through a series of inspiring classes beginning in March.

"We wanted to engage the over-50 population in the Valley," explains Jess Dervin-Ackerman, "and address their desires and needs." Dervin-Ackerman, a potter and painter with a background in community organizing, is the new executive director of the Creative Coalition.

North Fork Senior Connections helped survey over seventy older adults in the community as to preferred topics as well as best days/times, resulting in a great lineup to kickoff the initiative. Pre-registration is required as class sizes are limited, by signing up at northforkcreative.org/artful-aging. The four upcoming offerings:

• Beginning Pottery, March 5th to 28th, Tuesdays & Thursdays, 10am -12pm at Paonia Clayworks. The four-week course taught by Summer Ester Orr focuses on hand-

building techniques creating functional objects like cups, bowls, trays, and other vessels, as well as glazing. Class includes one 25 lb. bag of clay, glazes, and firing.

- Gentle Movement & Yoga, March 4th 29th on Mondays 10:15 am 11:15 am & Fridays 9 am 10 am at Paonia Laundromat (a great space.) Mona Linehan will help participants increase and/or maintain mobility with movements that can be integrated into everyday life. Suitable for all levels, this class helps to build strength and flexibility.
- Watercolor, April 29th May 22nd, Mondays & Wednesdays 10am 12pm at The Creamery Arts Center in Hotchkiss. Students will learn the basics of watercolor painting over 4 weeks, covering foundational techniques, color mixing and brushwork. Teacher Dione Holt has traveled the world with a sketchbook and a small watercolor kit!
- Storytelling 101, April 4th May 15th, Thursdays 9:30am 12pm at Crawford Town Hall Classroom. Gifted memoir teacher Yuri Chicovsky leads this fun and relaxed course designed to bring an added level of confidence and awareness to your storytelling repertoire. Over six weeks of once-weekly classes, explore the timeless art of storytelling. Using a fun and creative selection process, students will curate several life stories for telling in both casual and formal settings, including campfires, family gatherings, local radio, and beyond!
