Finding Solutions to Help Seniors Age in Place

Volunteering Makes All The Difference

Certain birthdays drive aging home, especially the numbers ending in zero.... But any year can do it. The indomitable Lynne Bear topped 97 in June, and she's just stepped down from her long-held post as President of the Paonia Senior Center. Lynne has been a rock, a legend, a workhorse. But everything changes.

Yet Lynne Bear will continue to serve in a new way, even if she doesn't run the Center's Board meetings. She understands the needs of this community and its elders, and that volunteering can make life better for those on both sides of the equation. Service to others comes early to some. 13-year-old Zinnia Bender, daughter of our outgoing Senior Connections' Treasurer Jenn Lukesh, already has 15 Service Saturdays under her belt and has touched the lives of many local seniors.

Rylee Lopez is older—she's all of 29. Studying at Colorado Mesa University, Rylee read an article about connecting with elders, where the author mentioned a goal: to build a world where caring for each other happens not at the fringes of society, but at its heart. That inspired Rylee to create North Fork Flowers CSA under the auspices of North Fork Senior Connections. "Volunteering to me means slowing down enough in our busy world to listen to someone else. It's one small way I can pay respect to the generations that have come before me."

Studies show that flowers help to reduce feelings of isolation and improve short term cognitive memory. A bouquet thrilled one Hotchkiss senior to tears, for nobody had brought her flowers for thirty-five years. Rylee plans to continue delivering these mason jar bouquets, created with the invaluable help of organic grower Carol Sikora, to seniors in the North Fork Valley monthly during the growing season. So if you've been wondering what the world is coming to, consider these young people and take hope.

But it's never too late. One of our most active NFSC volunteers is 83. Her vitality and organizational skills continue to amaze, uplifting the lives of women with physical challenges while inspiring the rest of us. Studies show volunteering provides a sense of purpose and community. Older volunteers walk more, are less likely to develop high blood pressure, have sharper cognitive skills and

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a reduction in heart disease.

Don't think you have any skills?

- We need more drivers to transport local seniors to appointments and events through our Neighborly Rides program—especially someone who'd be willing to help a Somerset senior retain his independence by driving him to get water and groceries in Hotchkiss and Paonia.
- Perhaps you can climb ladders, move furniture, or wield an electric drill (not everyone can...) Become a "Handy Helper!"
- Feel like you're already too busy? What if you could make a real difference by giving a single Service Saturday morning in early November to help community elders prepare for the upcoming winter?
