Finding Solutions to Help Seniors Age in Place

Even Better Together: North Fork Senior Center Join Forces

For more than five decades, Paonia Senior Center has provided a gathering place for community elders. During the pandemic, the Center was forced to shut its doors for about a year and sadly lost several members to Covid during that time. Upon reopening to the public, a new generation of seniors began participating in Senior Center activities beside the longtime members.

In recent years the building has become a hub of activities for those over 60, hosting lively programs to keep the senior community engaged and informed: the popular SAIL exercise classes

provided by North Fork EMS, a meditation group, a memoir writing group and Thursday lunches catered by local chefs as well as the previously-established M-W-F meals from Volunteers of America. We've recently added TUES-DAYS@2, rotating fascinating guest presenters with a

book club and the popular Song Circle spear-headed by singer-songwriter Ellen Stapenhorst.

For the past few years, Paonia Senior Center generously provided free office and program space to North Fork Senior Connections, the local non-profit that offers a variety of services and programs for seniors throughout the North Fork Valley. Both nonprofits share common goals and values, helping elders age gracefully in their own homes and within a supportive community.

After months of discussion, the boards of Paonia Senior Center and North Fork Senior Connections have decided that the needs of local elders would be better served by formally joining forces. Therefore, we are pleased to announce to the community that, as of March 1, 2025, Paonia Senior Center (aka Paonia Senior Citizens Inc.) and North Fork Senior Connections have fully integrated our two boards of directors, our financial resources, including management of the senior center building at 106 3rd Street in Paonia, and our fundraising efforts.

Many locals already think these two non-profits, housed in the same building and providing services to the same demographic, are one and

the same, so the announcement of this "merger" may or may not surprise you. But rest assured, all the exciting programs and activities will continue, with a bigger pool of volunteers and more staff hours.

Our unified senior service organization will need your

ongoing support to thrive. We continually seek foundation grants to support our efforts, but we depend on local contributions to keep our programs going and to pay our dedicated staff. Your donations, large or small, enable us to sustain and expand our efforts. NFSC is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, making donations tax-deductible.

Outreach efforts will continue to seniors throughout the North Fork Valley, utilizing volunteer Handy Helpers as well as drivers who provide free rides anywhere in Delta County through the Neighborly Rides initiative. Plans are afoot to offer new programming for Craw-
